<p><b>SMOHIT Safety Sense</b>          Toolbox Talks for the Sheet Metal Industry</p>	<p><b>HAZWOPER</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response Standard (HAZWOPER) applies to employers and workers who are exposed or potentially exposed to hazardous substances. The HAZWOPER Standard is designed to safeguard the safety and health of hazardous waste site workers and emergency response personnel.</li> <li>• This standard also establishes methods and procedures for recognizing, evaluating and controlling hazardous substances.</li> <li>• A written HAZWOPER plan must state:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ exactly what chemicals are on the site based on surveys performed before any cleanup begins;</li> <li>○ exactly how chemicals in the air will be measured;</li> <li>○ exactly how the cleanup work will be done;</li> <li>○ exactly how information about the chemicals on site will be shared with workers;</li> <li>○ exactly what special suits and other protective gear are needed;</li> <li>○ exactly how to clean off or decontaminate suits when you leave the work area;</li> <li>○ exactly what kind of doctor's exams, if any, are needed; and</li> <li>○ exactly what to do if there is a spill, fire, or other emergency on the site.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Basically, every section of the HAZWOPER plan should explain what to do, where to do it, when it needs to be done, who will do it, and how to do it.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Instructor Tips</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Review your company's written HAZWOPER plan with workers.</b></li> <li>• <b>Emphasize to workers that they should review MSDS sheets for the shop or job site prior to performing work in a hazardous environment.</b></li> </ul>
